## Why choose CPD Direct?

## How do I access my content?

We recommend bookmarking the portal log in page ([click here](#)) for quick access to your learning. Once you have purchased a subscription and logged in you can search via the Explore tab, where you can filter by various options or search by topics/keywords in the search box. Once you have started a module, it will appear under **My Learning > In Progress**.

## What is involved in the interactive online modules?

The interactive eLearning modules are designed to provide you with opportunities to consider and reflect on the content and/or test your knowledge through activities which could include: reflective questions, quizzes and case studies.

## Can I claim CPD units?

Yes. If the educational activity extends your knowledge and skills in areas that are relevant to your practice, you can claim 1 CPD unit per 1 hour of activity.
